## DID YOU KNOW?

## From the 6<sup>th</sup> April 2017 bereavement payments changed!

If your husband, wife or civil partner died after 6<sup>th</sup> April 2017 you may be able to apply for the new Bereavement Support Payment. This replaces the old system of being able to claim either a one off bereavement payment, a bereavement allowance (previously a widow's pension) or a widowed parent's allowance (applicable if you are bringing up children). These latter benefits may still apply if your husband, wife or civil partner died before 6<sup>th</sup> April 2017.

The new benefit can be applied for if the deceased paid National insurance contributions for 25 weeks or they died in an industrial accident or by a disease caused by work. BUT when they died you must be under state pension age and be living in the UK.

If you fit the eligibility criteria you will receive one large lump sum payment and then 18 monthly payments eg. no children under 20 in full time education you will receive one payment of £2500.00 and then 18 monthly payments of £100.00. You must claim within 3 months of the loss to get the full entitlement. If you claim up to 21 months after the loss you will be paid less.

# HELP!

Loss can be an unpleasant experience for anyone, and as no two people experience loss in the same way it is often difficult for people to share that loss and thus find comfort. Many people find speaking to someone who is impartial, none judgmental and who is willing to simply listen a great comfort.

# Stafford & District Bereavement & Loss Support Service:

Established in 1984 the organisation now works in partnership with Katharine House Hospice. Offering support to people experiencing grief regardless of sex, gender, religion ect. There is a flexible appointment system and the service is free although a donation would be appreciated.

The site gives advice on everything related to a loss from registering the death, death certificates, probate through to funeral arrangements etc.

The site also gives details of other organisations that may be able to help you through the process.

#### St Giles Family Support and Bereavement Service.

Individual Counselling and support for adults and children held at Whittington Hospice, Sutton Hospice or at home. Transport may be available for those with no transport.

Adult support groups offer the chance to share experiences and feelings in a safe and supportive environment. Groups consist of 6 / 8 and generally last for 6 sessions.

Child support can be 1 to 1 counselling or in sibling/family groups.

Sutton Hospice offer Young People's workshops which use activities and themes to help young.people express themselves. Groups consist of 6/8 young people who can then engage in a social activity which they share with parents or guardians.
